



# Cabinetmaking-Carpentry Competition 2022 State Fair

**DATE:** Tuesday, September 27, 2022

**TIME:** 10:00 a.m. Registration

**PLACE:** State Fairgrounds at The Meadows in Doswell, Va., Caroline County

**SKILLSUSA COORDINATOR:** Jerry Baker

**SCOPE OF THE COMPETITION-** Students will compete in timed stations to assess skills in various aspects of cabinetmaking and carpentry

**Stations Include the Following:**

- 1) Drill and install a cabinet knob centered on a drawer front.
  - a. Students will use a combination square to mark the center of the drawer front and layout the knob hole
  - b. Students will use a drill to drill the hole
  - c. Students will use a screwdriver to install the knob
- 2) Biscuit a right angle joint
  - a. Students will use a biscuit joiner to cut biscuit slots on the end and face of a board and properly assemble the joint
- 3) Apply Peel and Stick edge banding and trim flush
  - a. Students will apply peel and stick edge banding to plywood and trim flush using hand tools such as a roller, banding trimmer, and flush cut pliers
- 4) Pre-drill, countersink, drive wood screws
  - a. Students will use a drill to join two boards together using wood screws
  - b. Students will use a combination countersink bit to drill holes
  - c. Students will use a drill to drive wood screws
- 4.b) Plug and trim dowel plugs
  - a. Students will glue in a dowel plug
  - b. Students will flush trim the dowel with a manual pull saw
- 5) Pocket screw a butt joint
  - a. Students will use a drill to drill pocket holes using the Kreg pocket hole jig
  - b. Students will use a drill and clamp to drive pocket holes to secure the joint

- 6) Level a board
  - a. Students will use a level to set a board level

Full rotation will take approximately 30-45 minutes

**Notes:**

- Assemblies out of quality tolerance will have -15 second penalty
- Fastest overall time wins
- Stations will be set-up “head-to-head” so two students can compete at once but only time matters
- Students will be presented a “score card” on check-in with each station listed
  - o Students can do the stations in any order
  - o Students present the score card to the station coordinator
  - o Station coordinator fills in student time on score card
  - o Students present filled score card to scorers table
- Stations will include leader boards to list name of students with top times

**JUDGING CRITERIA:** Please refer to *SkillsUSA Championships Technical Standards*.

**TOOLS AND MATERIALS REQUIRED BY CONTESTANTS:**

Safety glasses and dress appropriately

**SAFETY STATEMENT:** All entries must present at registration, the attached Safety Statement signed by students and advisors. Safety glasses and dress appropriate to the trade and public viewing are required.

**TOOLS TO BE PROVIDED BY THE TECHNICAL COMMITTEE**

**DEADLINE:** Schools must register contestant by September 16, 2022. Contestant names must be submitted to the State SkillsUSA Specialist by September 16, 2022. Substitutions may be made the day of the competition.

- *Participants must have a Student Competition Ticket to enter the Fairgrounds unless they are already at the Fair for another competition.*
- *Teachers are responsible for ordering tickets online by September 16, 2022 directly from the State Fair Ticket Office using a State Fair Student Competition Ticket Order Form, which can be found on-line at [www.skillsusa.org](http://www.skillsusa.org) under 'State Fair'*
- *Tickets must be ordered online so everyone can enter near contest site(Gate 2)You will be allowed to park in the parking lot near Gate 2 with advance tickets. No picking up tickets on site.*

**Safety Notice:** Each contestant is responsible for bringing the proper PPE to wear while participation in the contest. Also, each contestant must turn in a signed SkillsUSA Safety Form to the competition chairman on the day of the competition.
